! Public outcry caused a "dramatic shift in policy" (1). We forced the <u>Canadian government</u> to disavow the war even though it quietly continues to assist the war effort. Now there is pressure on the Liberals to publicly fall back in line behind the U.S.

! The vast majority of people around the world know this invasion is immoral and illegal. Only a few governments, notably the **British**, defied their own populations and joined the attack.

 Interview U.S. ambassador tells us "Canada provides more support for this war in Iraq indirectly than most of the countries that are fully supporting it." (2) Canada is the third largest contributor to the U.S. led war, behind only Britain and Australia. <u>Canadian</u> <u>Defence Department</u> involvement includes exchange troops, war planners, surveillance of Iraq and protecting U.S. aircraft carriers. (3) Meanwhile, Canadian companies sell over \$1 billion in military goods to the U.S. annually.

! The <u>Bush administration</u> is issuing new threats and looking forward to their next invasion. (4) We will not be silent when death rains down on cities. Not this war. Not the next war. Not ever!

We demand the Canadian Government:

End direct and indirect support for the invasion and occupation of Iraq.

Stand firmly, promptly and unambiguously against all wars of aggression.

Withdraw our troops and military equipment from Iraq and the Persian Gulf.

Ban military exports to countries at war, including the USA.
